



Jacob's Well

1. A perennial karstic spring in the Texas Hill Country flowing from the bed of Cypress Creek, located northwest of Wimberley, Texas. It consists of two principal conduits. One passageway measures approximately 4,500 feet (1,400m) from the surface with a maximum depth of 137 feet (42m), and a secondary one extends approximately 1,000 feet (300m) in length from the point where it diverges from the main conduit.

2. (also known as Jacob's Fountain or the Well of Sychar) A Christian holy site located in Balata village, a suburb of the Palestinian city of Nablus in the West Bank. It is named in the New Testament Gospel of John as the scene of Jesus's encounter with the Samaritan woman.
